Short & Snappy - Adult Recognition

Objective

To help participants embrace the importance of adult volunteer recognition and to learn formal and informal ways to recognize volunteers!

Length

20 minutes

Materials Needed

Pens/pencils and paper; handout



Information to Share (spend 5 minutes on this section)

It is so important to recognize Girl Scout volunteers! It is the Volunteers who run this organization. They are the ones who are hands on, teaching the girls everything they can, in order to build girls with courage, confidence, and character. Recognition reminds volunteers how much we appreciate them and gives them the strength to keep working with girls to make the world a better place.

How can we recognize volunteers?

Formal recognition and awards: Girl Scouts of Utah has Community-level and Council-level awards for volunteers! If you think someone should receive such an award, all you have to do is nominate them on our website and get someone to endorse your nomination! It is particularly special when you get girls to nominate their leaders and mentors for such awards.

- Council awards are presented at Recognition of Excellence every year!
- Contact your Community Recognition and Delegate Representative to find out about when your Community has its awards ceremony!
- Keys to Successful Nomination:
 - The nomination form and attached letters are very important in the nomination process. The Volunteer Recognition Committee reviews the nominations, and they may never have met the volunteer before. It is important to be thorough and descriptive.
 - Make sure all the blanks on the form have been completed especially the brief statement explaining why that volunteer deserves the award.
 - o Make sure all of the nominator's personal information is complete and they are a current member.
 - Be sure to email the required number of endorsement letters to awards@gsutah.org before the deadline. These should be formal, descriptive letters, and must each be written by a different person.
- Contact your Community Recognition and Delegate Representative with any questions.

Informal recognition: There are all kinds of ways to recognize volunteers throughout the year! Here are a few:

- Shout out on your GS Community Facebook page!
- Small thank-you cards, birthday cards, and gifts to show appreciation!
- Girls perform a song or poem at the Community Meeting dedicated to the volunteer!

Activity – Why wait? Let's start now! (spend 10 minutes on this section)

Actions:

- 1. Have people get into partners or small groups (depending on how many there are).
- 2. Each group should pick a volunteer that they feel deserves recognition. Encourage them to choose someone who may not have been recognized before. If that person is present at the meeting, all the better!
- 3. Each group should write create a short poem, chant, cheer, song, or draw a picture that recognizes the volunteer they chose.
- 4. Have everyone share/present their informal recognition (especially if the volunteer is present)!

Ending – Challenge and handout (spend 5 minutes on this section)

- 1. Hand out the attached list of formal awards.
- 2. Challenge everyone to commit to:
 - a. Nominating or writing the endorsement letter for at least 1 volunteer this year.
 - b. Coming up with and executing an informal recognition for someone who deserves it. Complete within the next 6 months.

A token of appreciation and acknowledgement of exceptional quality from an individual or group (usually for a

first- or one-time contribution to GS).



Noteworthy New Leader

An exceptional troop leader or co-leader within their first two years who has truly shared the spirit of Girl Scouting with girls

and adults in the troop.



Community Girl Scout Family Award

Recognizes outstanding contributions made by girls and their entire family unit through their service to the Girl Scout Community



Special Supporters Certificate

Honoring ongoing or second-time contributions from groups or individuals supporting Girl Scout Communities.



Emerald Award

Outstanding/above and beyond volunteer performance that has enhanced the work and furthered the goals of the Community for at least 3 years. (1 letter of endorsement)

Outstanding Volunteer

Outstanding/above and beyond volunteer performance that has enhanced the work of troops and/or the Community for at least 2 vears. (1 letter of endorsement)

Outstanding volunteers working above and beyond in delivering the GSLE or council mission to girls. (1 letter of
