

Packing List – Please label your belongings.

Clothing

Closed-toed, closed-heeled shoes (1)	Socks (2-3)
Warm sweater and/or sweatshirt (1)	Hat with brim
Pants & shorts (1 pair each depending on weather)	Knit hat (depending on weather)
T-shirts (2)	Rain Gear (waterproof jacket or poncho)
Long sleeved shirt (1)	Warm pajamas (1)
Underwear (2)	Warm coat

Camp Gear

Sleeping bag rated to 20 degrees or cooler	Sunglasses
Pillow	Backpack or daypack
Warm blanket or fleece liner	Flashlight with extra batteries

24-32 ounce durable water bottle

Toiletries

Toothbrush & Toothpaste	Sunscreen & Lip Balm (SPF 15+)
Hairbrush/comb	Insect repellent
Deodorant	Sanitary supplies

Optional Equipment

Camera	Stuffed animal
Pen/Pencil	Book

Items to Leave at Home

Candy, gum, food or soda	iPods, MP3 players, CD players, etc.
Curling irons, blow dryers, straighteners, etc.	iPads, Kindles, Nooks, and other electronic devices
Items packaged in glass containers	Cell phones

Personal sports equipment (archery equipment, climbing gear, lifejackets, riding helmets, etc.)

Animals (your pets will do much better at your home than in the camp environment)

Electronic items can easily be damaged in the camp environment.

Weather and Special Packing Considerations

Please note it may be quite a bit cooler at camp than in the Salt Lake valley so plan accordingly based on the year.

Camp Guidelines

Girls and Adults

- Observe the Girl Scout Law and Promise (including being respectful of others' belongings).
- Use the buddy system.
- Walk in camp.
- Wear sturdy, closed-toed and closed-heeled shoes and socks at all times; no sandals.
- Quiet hours are from 10 p.m. to 7 a.m.
- Snow piles by buildings are very dangerous and are off limits.
- Please eat only at the tables and not on the couches or in the sleeping areas. Please leave gum at home.
- Please don't use paint or use markers on the dining tables without covering them.
- No leather working on the dining hall tables.

Adults

- Adults must supervise their girls at all times (within sight and hearing distance).
- Trefoil Ranch is a firearm-, mace-, and weapon-free environment.
- In case of emergency, notify the Community Event or Outdoor Representative before leaving camp.
- Trefoil Ranch is an alcohol-free and smoke-free environment. Those choosing to smoke must walk down the road and be on the opposite side of the camp gates.
- Family pets should be left at home.
