# Juliette Families Corner: Keeping it Girl Scout Led

Girl Scouts is a youth-led program, but you may be wondering what that means. Youth-led or girl-led means that your Juliette takes charge of their own Girl Scout experience. This builds independence, leadership skills, and more. This looks different at every age, but here are some ideas to keep your Juliette's experience Girl Scout-led:

- For young Girl Scouts, start out by giving basic choices, such as what color to use for a craft or picking a badge activity from two choices.
- For older Girl Scouts, help them self-direct their experience by choosing activities, badges, and Journeys.
- As Girl Scouts get older, give them even more opportunities to lead their experience, such as doing their own research for how they would like to earn a badge.
- When working on Journeys, have Girl Scouts pick Take Action Projects that are meaningful to them. Work with them on brainstorming what they care about, then develop a project from that. For example, caring about animals might lead you to organize a pet food drive at your school.
- Rather than choosing a single way to do an activity, give choices, such as choosing colors, textures, and other materials for a craft project.
- Give your Juliette the opportunity to be an advocate for others and themselves, helping them develop key skills in leadership.
- When your Juliette is working on their Silver or Gold award, encourage them to take the lead by sending their own emails (even if it's from your

account), taking the lead on coordination, and doing as much as possible on their own.



# Awesome Activities: Craft your way to a Craft and Tinker badge!

This month's awesome activity is from the Junior Craft and Tinker badge. Step two is to "tinker with your craft," by using tools, and new materials, or by playing with the function of your craft. Since Spring is right around the corner, we thought it would be great to share this fun Girl Scout Trefoil Nail Art project. By using tools like a hammer and printer, you can create a beautiful craft to show your love of Girl Scouting.

Start by printing the template. Then, using the template as a guide, add nails. Remove the paper and wrap string between the nails. Enjoy your new trefoil!
