# **Recognizing our Highest Award Girl Scouts**

This past year, our council had 68 Bronze Award, 44 Silver Award, and 7 Gold Award Girl Scouts. We recognized these incredible girls on November 5 at our annual Recognition of Excellence ceremony.

This year's Gold Award projects include building safe spaces for children in the justice system, supporting disabled adults, starting an entrepreneurship club for young women, preventing soil erosion, raising awareness about concussions, making medical play dolls, and raising awareness about radon levels in homes.

The Bronze, Silver, and Gold Awards are the Highest Awards a Girl Scout can earn. Girl Scouts complete a Take Action project that requires leadership and community engagement to solve a problem with a sustainable solution and a measurable impact. We were honored to recognize all these amazing accomplishments.

# GSU Robotics team attends Utah STEM Week Proclamation

On November 7, GSU's robotics team, The Traffic Cone Pigeon Girls, attended Governor Spencer Cox's official proclamation for Utah's first Week of STEM: November 7-10, 2022. They also gave Governor Cox a demonstration of the robot they built for their FIRST robotics competition. FIRST robotics gets girls involved in a long-term STEM activity while increasing their interest in science and engineering.

The Week of STEM celebrates and highlights the importance of creating greater inclusion and opportunity for Utah children and families who do not typically have adequate access to STEM resources.

Women are in the minority in most STEM fields and makeup one-quarter of the overall STEM workforce. Factors that contribute to this low number of women in the field include access to STEM activities, encouragement, financial aid, and social pressures. Girl Scouts seeks to change the outcomes for women in STEM by providing girls with engaging and progressive STEM activities.
