- A. Learn about the history of money. When did we start using money? How did we purchase items and goods before we had money?
- B. We can learn much about other countries around the world through their money. Explore the artistry of money from around the world. What is money called in Brazil, China, Europe, and other countries?
- C. What is a minted coin? Why do coins get minted?
- D. Learn about the dollar bill. What kind of paper are they printed on? Beneath the pyramid, what does Novus Ordo Seclorum mean? Why is MDCCLXXVI on the bottom of the pyramid? Take out a magnifying glass and explore everything on the dollar bill.
- E. How, when, and why is money printed? What are the security features with money that make it to where people cannot print their own? Look at the watermarks, inks, printing patterns, security tags.
- F. Design your own money. Use your own phrases, numbers, and images that represent you.
- G. Why is a dollar worth a dollar? How has the value of a dollar changed over time?
