- A. Learn about the things that your family has to budget for month to month. Build a budget for meeting your family's current expenses (food, utilities, rent, loan payments, entertainment, etc.). - **B.** Talk with people to find out how they have saved for larger purchases/expenses like a car, house or college. Think of something you would like to buy. How much money would you need to save?
- **C.** To reach your financial dreams you need to make money. What job or career would you like to pursue and how much do people who are in that job/career typically make? What jobs can you do now to earn money?

- **E.** What is the difference between credit and debit cards? What is a credit score? What habits need to be practiced to achieve a high credit score? How can teenagers begin to build their own credit rating?

- **G.** Research new ways that technology is changing banking and payment methods. Are they more or less secure than traditional banking practices?
