

Short and Snappy – Juliette Gordon Low



Objective

To learn some fun facts about Juliette Gordon Low and to better understand our Girl Scout legacy.

Length

20 minutes

Materials Needed

Pencils and paper



Information to Share (spend 5 minutes on this section)

Juliette Gordon Low founded the Girl Scouts in 1912, after having worked with guides and scouting in Europe. Having experienced both privileges and difficult challenges throughout her life, Juliette believed in empowering young women for self-sufficiency by preparing them for anything. Even in 1912, Juliette strove to break down barriers that limited women, by fostering individual growth, character, and life skills.

Activity (spend 15 minutes on this section)

1. Get into teams, have groups make team names, and set up a team score board in the front of the room.
2. Ask the following trivia questions (next page), awarding points to the team that gets the correct answer.
3. Total up scores to find a winner.
4. Reflection: wrap up with a reflection discussion on the importance and pride we can feel in the legacy that Juliette left for us.
