


GSUSA does not approve, endorse, or provide safety checkpoints for "not permitted" activities. The following activities are in the **not permitted** category:

- Bungee jumping
- Flying in privately owned planes, helicopters, or blimps
- Hang gliding
- Untethered Hot-air ballooning
- Hunting
- Snowmobiling
- Riding a motorbike

- Riding electric scooters
- Using outdoor trampolines
- Parachuting or skydiving
- Parasailing
- Paintball tagging
- Riding all-terrain vehicles (ATVs)
- Stunt skiing
- Zorbing
