Girl Advisory Board (GAB)

What is GAB?

GAB is a girl-led program for Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors which puts them on a path to leadership and mentorship.

What do girls in GAB do?

Girls plan and run events for the Community. They can plan the events that they chose, many choose to plan a Journey in a Day for Brownies (which earns Cadettes the Leadership in Action award), Cookie Rally, or day camp. Girls have also planned Never the Same Weekend and other events. It's girl-led, so it's up to them!

Why do I want my girls to participate in GAB?

Girls have the opportunity to be mentored and learn how to work within a budget, set goals, and work with younger girls.

How often to GAB girls meet?

It's girl-led, so that's up to them. Most meet once a month for an hour or so while they are planning events.

Are there badges and awards for participating in GAB?

Girls have the opportunity to earn the Leadership awards for their level. Girls can earn their Service to Girl Scout bar, their Torch Award, Leadership in Action (LiA – Cadettes only). They can also count their time toward other awards for school, church, etc.
