Cookie Delay Update

Thank you for your patience, support, and understanding as we navigate this challenging cookie season. Today we updated our <u>cookie delay FAQs on our website</u>,

including the most current information from our baker as well as cookie booths, Digital Cookie, cookie cupboards, girl deliveries, customer communications, and more.

Tax Law Changes

Effective January 1, 2022, payments received into your account for product sales or other parental payments (dues, events, etc.) from a third party payment organization such as Square, Venmo, Paypal, etc. may result in a 1099 form issued by the IRS at the end of the calendar year. Girl Scouts of Utah highly recommends that you refrain from using all personal accounts for payments. As a reminder, Girl Scouts of Utah policy does not allow the use of Venmo for any troop accounts.

If you have any questions regarding this tax law change, GSUSA recommends that you consult your local tax advisor when preparing your tax return.

Over 50% of customers would increase their purchase if they knew it supported a girl's goals and adventures, so deck your booth out and boost your sales! Apply to be a Youth Representative to the GSU Board of Directors!

Experience the council's governance processes firsthand! As a Youth Representative, you'll participate in all Board functions as a non-voting member, provide perspective on various issues presented by the board, and present on different Girl Scouting topics and how each impacts you as a Girl Scout. Review the <u>full position description</u>.

Action needed: Girl Scouts ages 16 and older are eligible to apply. Youth Representatives serve a one-year term beginning on April 30, 2022. <u>Complete your application</u> by March 18.

Spring Renewal

It's time to start thinking about your next year of Girl Scouting!

Girls, adults, troops, and service units can earn incentives for renewing by May 31 as part of Spring Renewal, including a patch designed by one of our Girl Scouts and an exclusive members-only event!

Troop Leaders should take time during March to review their troop rosters and update troop information. If you have any questions, reach out to your Membership Support Specialist.

NEW – Avenues For Change (Delegate Patch Program)

The <u>Avenues for Change patch</u> aims to provide a way for Senior and Ambassador Girl Scouts to document their service to their communities while in a leadership position and give them the tools necessary to improve their service. The requirements focus on the wide range of ways Girl Scouts can serve and pursue important changes and provide insight into how organizations such as Girl Scouts operate to meet those same goals.

Volunteer Appreciation

Volunteer Appreciation Month is approaching, and we know Girl Scouts of Utah has the best volunteers around, and we want to celebrate their outstanding work with you!
