This year, three Utah state parks partnered with Girl Scouts of Utah to offer Girl Scouts "Love State Parks" programming: Dead Horse Point State Park, Wasatch Mountain State Park, and Utah Field House of Natural History State Park Museum!

Each park's activities and schedules will be different, so check out which option will work best for you. Some activities include adventuring on a full-moon hike at Dead Horse Point State Park, participating in a service project, learning about birds of prey at Wasatch Mountain State Park, and "recreating" the past by learning about dinosaurs at the Utah Field House of Natural History State Park Museum.

Even if you don't register for one of these three programs, we want to encourage all Girl Scouts and their families to visit a state park over the weekend of September 10, so mark your calendars!
