Highest Awards Tip of the Month

A core part of your Girl Scout's Highest Awards project will be measuring the impact of their project. If they measure their results as part of their efforts, they'll be able to speak confidently about the difference they have made in their community and measure the impact on their root cause.

When your Girl Scouts are in the planning stages, they should set a goal to help them know what to measure and when. Their goal may change as their project progresses, but this will help them understand when they have been successful and allows them to work towards a direction. When measuring, have your Girl Scouts consider the questions "How much?" and "How many?". They might be counting the number of members in a group or views on a website. Or, if your Girl Scouts are trying to educate someone or change their behavior, they may use a pre & post survey to measure how much their participants have learned or assess what behaviors their participants have changed.

A measurable result will also help Girl Scouts talk about their accomplishments and let the world know what a great project they completed!

Volunteer Recognition

Adult Achievement Awards highlight outstanding volunteers and staff whose contributions to the council enhance the experience of Girl Scouts across our council.

The **GSU Legacy of Service Award** recognizes outstanding contributions made by two or more family members who continue the tradition of service for two or more generations.

The **Appreciation Pin** recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) with impact on one geographic area, service unit, or program delivery audience.

The **Volunteer of Excellence Award** recognizes volunteers who have contributed outstanding service while partnering directly with girls in any pathway to implement the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) through the use of the National Program Portfolio or in support of the Council's mission delivery to girls and adult members.

The **GSU Freddie Award** recognizes an adult volunteer who has delivered outstanding service to Girl Scouts of Utah through working with girls and adults in the areas of program and training, and has made a significant contribution to other community organizations (church, school, civic, cultural) through holding a leadership position and/or providing long-term service to that organization.

The **Honor Pin** recognizes an adult volunteer who has provided outstanding service to two or more geographic areas or program delivery audiences in a way that furthers the council's goals and provides service that goes beyond the expectations of the position requirements.

The **Thanks Badge** recognizes a currently registered Girl Scout adult volunteer or staff member who provides outstanding service that benefits the total council or the entire Girl Scout Movement and provides service that is so significantly beyond expectation that no other award is appropriate.
