Celebrate Girl Scouts Love State Parks at Utah Field House of Natural History State Park Museum this year! Journey back in time and imagine what the world looked like when dinosaurs roamed the earth at the Utah Field House of Natural History Museum State Park!

Take on the role of a paleontologist as you reconstruct the life of a prehistoric creature. Create a model of a sauropod neck to experiment with how they moved, calculate the measurements of your wingspan if you were a dinosaur, and examine fossils to create a drawing of what the creature might have looked like when it was alive. You won't want to miss this prehistoric party!

The GSU Legacy of Service Award recognizes outstanding contributions made by two or more family members who continue the tradition of service for two or more generations.

- The Appreciation Pin recognizes an individual's exemplary service in support of delivering the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) with an impact on one geographic area, service unit, or program delivery audience.
- The Volunteer of Excellence Award recognizes volunteers who have contributed outstanding service while partnering directly with girls in any pathway to implement the Girl Scout Leadership Experience (GSLE) through the use of the National Program Portfolio or in support of the Council's mission delivery to girls and adult members.
- The GSU Freddie Award recognizes an adult volunteer who has delivered outstanding service to Girl Scouts of Utah through working with girls and adults in the areas of program and training and has made a significant contribution to other community organizations (church, school, civic, cultural) through holding a leadership position and/or providing long-term service to that organization.

Council Staff Update

Last week we celebrated Gloria Bircher who, after 17 years as a staff member, retired from Girl Scouts of Utah as she and her husband Henry are moving out of state. Gloria has filled numerous roles with Girl Scouts and has been a key component of our council staff.

Gloria's involvement in Girl Scouts spans two councils and 27 years. As an active volunteer for 10 years, Gloria served as a Troop Leader, Troop Cookie Manager, Service Unit Event Rep, Service Unit Cookie Manager, and Council Trainer with Tierra Del Oro Girl Scout Council (now Girl Scouts of the Heart of Central CA near Sacramento). On staff with TDOGS, Gloria managed Retail, Product Programs, and Fund Development. She was instrumental in developing eCookie, a precursor to eCouncil, a membership database system. Prior to these programs, everything was done by hand on paper.

In 2005, Gloria joined Girl Scouts of Utah (GSU) and helped implement the first GSU eCookie sale. Gloria impacted our membership in many ways, as Volunteer Support Specialist for Ogden, as the council Training Coordinator, in the Program

Department approving troop trip applications, in Risk Management creating volunteer policies, and as the Volunteer Award Coordinator. Gloria dedicated 7 years as the Cookie Program Coordinator, and most recently she was the Membership Support Specialist for Northern Utah. Gloria also helped organize Camporee in 2012 and was boots on the ground at the 2014 National Convention held in Salt Lake City, Utah.

We wish Gloria and Henry well as they embark on their next chapter.
