This week we are honoring our 2022 Girl Scout Bronze Award recipients. Bronze Award Girl Scouts are Juniors who complete a Take Action Project following the Bronze Award rubric and have their projects approved by GSU.

Take Action Projects differ from community service because they are long-lasting, help fix the root of an issue, create change that is sustainable, inspire and educate others, and are measurable. These projects encourage leadership skills, community connection, being a role model to younger Girl Scouts, making the world a better place, and following the Girl Scout Law.

This year, nearly 70 Girl Scouts earned their Bronze Award by organizing incredible community projects that benefited children, community health, pets, and more!

Volunteer Support

Updated Volunteer Policies

We highly encourage our volunteers to review the Volunteer Policies at the beginning of every Girl Scout year. Each year our council takes time to review the volunteer policies to make any necessary changes relevant to the work of Girl Scouts in Utah and ensure you, Girl Scout volunteers, have up-to-date information.

Action needed: Review the updated <u>Volunteer Essentials</u>, <u>Safety Activity</u> <u>Checkpoints</u>, and <u>GSU Volunteer Policies</u> and take the training on gsLearn.

Youth Protection Training is now Live!

If you received a training notification, please go into gsLearn and check your assignments. If you still cannot find it, or have any questions, please let our Training Specialist <u>Ruth Strawser</u> know, and she can help.

One important training is the Child Protection Training, which is presented with a new module. (The old one is now deactivated.) According to the Child

Protection Policy, all volunteers must complete the new training before interacting with youth.

Important details:

- You must complete this training BEFORE October 31, or before your next outing, event, or Girl Scout function that will involve girls.
- The training takes at least 30 minutes, so please set aside enough time.
- You will need to register with PCAU (Prevent Child Abuse Utah) to complete the first two steps of the training. You will receive a prompt at the appropriate time.
- You will need to complete Youth Protection Training even if you recently completed it or if you are currently compliant with Child Protection Training. This is because the new training is for the new Girl Scout year and for the new policy.
- After you complete all the assigned training, you will be considered compliant for three years.
- If would like to review documents in the additional references, re-open the
 training under your completed training or via the content library. When
 clicking on the training to review, it will ask you if you want to review or
 retake this training, be sure to always select "review" until it's time to retake
 the training. You can access anything in the training once you have
 completed it until it is due for renewal.

For Troop Leaders

Explore all year long without starting over! Now the "Explore" tab adds-on
to your meeting instead of resetting it. The choice is yours, combine preselected tracks or add individual meetings! If you need to delete your plan
and start over, the "Delete" button is on the "Year Plan" tab.

- Even more information about the Girl Scouts in a troop all in one place, grade, communication preferences, and secondary caregiver information is now on the "My Troop" tab.
- Are you looking for all the new content in one place? Use the New for 2022-2023 filter when searching for meetings (Explore Meetings or when you

- New Speaker Template! Invite topic experts to share their knowledge and passion with your troop. Use the Speaker invite under Manage Communication on the meeting plan to get started.
