Have You "Completely" Completed Youth Protection Training?

The new Youth Protection Training is a little different than the previous training for this subject. Not only did the title change, but there are five parts to this training. You need to complete all five-parts to be compliant.

- 1. Watch the video provided by Prevent Child Abuse Utah (PCAU).
- 2. Upload your certificate from PCAU to gsLearn Youth Protection Training.
- 3. Review the policies. You can do this by watching the provided video or reviewing the PDF, found in the additional references. Then complete the Knowledge Check for policies.
- 4. Review the resources guide. Found in the additional references as well. Then complete the Knowledge Check for the resource guide.
- 5. Finally, you must "sign" the agreement at the end of the Youth Protection Training module.

You will receive two emails from gsLearn. The first will confirm that you have completed the PCAU video, and the second confirms your completion of the training and are compliant. Also, you can confirm your completion under your achievements tab, and it will show how long you are compliant.

This updated training was created as a suggestion by our insurance provider to ensure that our program is taking the appropriate care of our youth. All troop leaders, co-leaders, and troop supporters must complete this training BEFORE they interact with girls.
