#### **Explore Our New Program Resources!**

We have two new, exciting program resources for troop leaders from our GSU Program Department! For older Girl Scouts, we have created our first STEM check out bin: Programming Robots for Cadettes, Seniors, and Ambassadors. This kit features almost everything you'll need to complete the Programming Robots badge for CSA, including a Sphero robot and tablet to use it. This kit is available for check out for troops wanting to complete the badge (badge not included) and can be reserved in UltraCamp, to be picked up and returned to the SLC office. There is a deposit and small fee to use the kit to pay for materials.

Next, we are pleased to announce that Badge in a Box is back! We are offering four different boxes at this time: two single level and two multilevel. Our single level boxes are Junior Jeweler and Cadette Trees, and our multilevel boxes are Daisy/Brownie/Junior Outdoor Art and all levels Outdoor Skills Beginner and Intermediate. These exciting boxes include almost everything that you'll need to complete the badge, including the badge itself, and can be ordered for a single Girl Scout or as a troop for a small discount per box. Boxes may be shipped or picked up in Salt Lake City. We are only doing online ordering at this time.

# Don't forget to complete your Youth Protection Training!

Girl Scouts of Utah has a new Youth Protection Training, and in accordance to our policy you must be completed BEFORE working with girls. The training is required for any volunteer position that interacts with girls. Those volunteer roles include troop leaders and co-leaders, troop supporters and troop product managers, and service team positions. Log into gsLearn and complete your training before the cookie season begins!

Watching your girls discover their strengths through engaging activities in science, technology, engineering, and math (STEM); the outdoors; and entrepreneurship might be one of the most satisfying aspects of your troop leader experience. But if you worry that you have zero experience in these any of these fields, you're not alone. For many troop leaders, covering certain program areas feels intimidating when their own skills in a subject may be lacking.

But you don't need to work in a STEM field to help your girls build a robot or be a professional artist to lead your girls in a craft. Every troop leader brings something unique to her troop, and you'll find that no matter your individual interests, you'll learn and grow alongside your girls—that's the wonderful part of the Girl Scout experience!

Maranda Oliver, a troop leader in the Girl Scouts of Wisconsin Badgerland council, understands what it's like to guide girls through unfamiliar territory. She shared her confidence-building experiences, and we hope <u>her story</u> inspires you on your troop leader journey!
