

GSU Policy Review: Troop / Group Policies

Troops must have:

- A minimum of 5 registered girls.
- A minimum of two adult leaders, of which at least one is female, who are not related to each other (by blood, partnership or marriage) and do not live in the same household.
 - If two volunteers are related, (by marriage, partnership, or blood) they must always have another unrelated volunteer present.
- Any adults serving in a ratio or volunteer capacity for a troop must be an approved volunteer, e.g., troop leaders, co-leaders, troop produce managers (TPM), troop supporters (drivers, chaperones, treasurers, first-aiders, camp advisors, etc.)

GSU Policy Review: Troop / Group Policies

Required Girl to Adult Ratios

Girl Scouts' adult-to-girl ratios show the minimum number of adults needed to supervise a specific number of girls. These supervision ratios were devised to ensure the safety and health of girls.





2021 Annual Appeal Recap


- 22 Service Units participated from October 2020 –

Annual Appeal



Girl Scouts of Utah's Annual Appeal is a way for Girl Scout families to financially support Girl Scouting in Utah beyond their own family. A donation to the Annual Appeal directly impacts all girls in Utah by funding girl programming. Each service unit has an Annual Appeal goal. When the goal is met, a percentage of money raised goes back to the service unit

Ways to Give

One-Time Gift - Make a one-time gift on the GSU website or during membership registration/renewal. Any donation over \$25 will receive a commemorative patch.

Daisy's Circle – A monthly giving program you can join for as little as \$5 a month. All Daisy's Circles members will receive a Daisy's Circle pin, as well as a renewal gift each year.

Adopt-a-Horse – Troops or individuals can symbolically adopt a horse for \$350. All money raised goes directly toward the equestrian program at Trefoil Ranch. Adopt-a-Horse donors will receive an adoption certificate, fact sheet about their horse, and an invitation to a donor event at Trefoil Ranch in June 2022.

Workplace Giving - Set up a donation as a deduction from your paycheck. Many companies will also match donations.
