In-Person Meeting Requirements





The following requirements MUST be followed for in-person meetings:

- All participants must complete
 <u>Pre-Screening and Symptom Check</u> forms
- All participants must complete a <u>Council COVID Assumption</u> of <u>Risk</u>, <u>Release</u>, and <u>Waiver</u> before their first participation with a troop
 - Troops may gather in groups of 25 or fewer, ONLY if their meeting place is within a moderate or low risk county (see troop meeting size requirements)








The following requirements MUST be followed for in-person meetings:

- •Girls and adults must wear masks, regardless of local and state mandates
- •Social distancing must be observed, maintaining 6 feet distance
- •Outdoors is preferred to indoors, whenever possible
- Meetings may NOT be held in homes







The following requirements MUST be followed for in-person meetings:

- •All attendees should continue to practice increased hygiene measures
- •The appropriate adult-to-girl ratio within this larger group size must also be observed
- Carry disinfectant and make sure girls are using it as appropriate
- •Girls bring their own snacks and supplies whenever possible





Travel within the state of Utah and United States is allowed, when COVID guidelines are followed and precautions are adhered to.

- If traveling outside of Utah, research that states' restrictions and meet all safety requirements
- Face coverings must be worn regardless of the mandates in the state you are visiting
- Strongly recommend COVID vaccinations and COVID testing when possible for all travelers
- Ensure there will be at least six feet distance between travelers' heads while sleeping
- Always follow Safety Activity Checkpoints
- COVID risk is fluid, so have contingency plans in case you have to reschedule or cancel

- At this time, GSU is not recommending international travel
- GSU is not currently allowing overnights at council facilities until resident camp season begins in June



We currently have 13 Service Units involved in this year's Annual Appeal!




2 Service Units have met their Annual Appeal goal!

Renewal begins April 1






