Simplifying The Volunteer Experience

Volunteering is difficult and so much work for Troop Leaders.

Troop Leaders are volunteering an average of 12 hours per month, not including Cookies.

Troop Leaders get lots of information when they start, but not a clear sense of what to do at troop meetings. 29% of Troop Leaders specifically highlighted a program plan as a need. Troop Leaders need to be better prepared for their role.
61% of Troop Leaders identify training as a pain point.

So how do we address these concerns?
