### Key dates

- **Sunday, February 12** -- Girl Scout initial orders are due by 11:59 p.m. With supply shortages, the initial orders are the priority.
- **Wednesday, February 15** – Initial orders are due by Troop Product Managers (TPMs).
- **Monday, February 27** – Customers can begin ordering cookies – including the new Raspberry Rally cookie -- that can be shipped directly to them.
- **Saturday, March 18** – Warehouse cookie pick-up.

- **Friday, March 24** – Cookie Booths begin.

Troop Product Managers can purchase the charms below (while supplies last) for incentive rewards.



**Community**

Ex: If they sell at a community event.



**Oyster**

Ex: If they sell a certain amount of Adventur'fuls



**Booth Stand**

Ex: They sell cookies at a booth.



**Phone**

Ex: If they call a certain amount of family and friends



**Raspberry**

Ex: If they sell Raspberry Rallies



**Shoe**

Ex: If they walk around their neighborhood selling.

## Service Unit Information

### NEW Service Unit Delegate orientation and training

Delegates and Alternate Delegates can now take updated training related to their important roles on gsLearn. This training will teach the difference between governance and operations, it will go over your role and responsibilities as a delegate, and it will explain how you can participate in council meetings. Delegates must take this course at the beginning of their two-year term.

How to access the training:

- Adults can log into their MyGS account and click on gsLearn on the left-hand menu; once in gsLearn, 674 Service Unit Delegate & Alternate Training will be active on your gsLearn dashboard.
- Girl Delegates can receive access to gsLearn. To access the gsLearn platform:
- Must have their email address unique to them (can't belong to another adult who has already used it for registration or learning processes)

- Girls will receive a direct link to the gsLearn platform for girl use only. Volunteers/adults will continue to log in through the VTK through myGS.
- Girls will need to forward their email to [info@gsutah.org](mailto:info@gsutah.org) to be added to gsLearn and given access to this training.

**Action needed:** Service Unit Delegate Reps, share this information with all of your delegates and ask that they try to complete the training before Town Hall Meeting on February 23. The Course takes about 25-30 minutes, and will be available anytime a refresher is needed.
