Camporee 2026

Fees

- *Due at registration:* \$100 deposit + \$5/person to reserve their spot
- *Due by May 20, 2026:* \$100/person

Activities

- Mix of Troop Time (filled with the troop's own programming) and programs facilitated by camporee committee and Program Aides
- Program areas: campfire, outdoor skills, and more as designed by the camporee committee

Training

Troop Camping 101

Required for at least one troop leader

Meals

Camp will provide dinner each night. Troops are responsible for breakfast, lunch, and snacks, which will be cooked at their campsite.

Sleeping Areas

Bring your own tents to camp in the meadow!

Limited space in cabins and platform tents prioritized for Daisies, available for an additional fee.

Fees

- *Due at registration:* \$100 deposit + \$5/person to reserve their spot
- *Due by May 20, 2026:* \$195/person

Activities

- Troop leaders and camp staff work together
- Camp staff provide full programming, including program areas, campfires, and evening activities
- Program areas: art, hiking, rock climbing, and waterfront

Training

Not required for Troop Camping at summer camp due to presence and oversight of camp staff.

Meals

Camp will provide all meals and snacks in the dining hall.

Sleeping Areas

Platform tents or cabins

You do not need to bring your own tents.
