Nola Adams was a Girl Scout when she was younger for three years until her troop disbanded. She then found her way back to Girl Scouting about 23 years ago, after her daughter saw a flyer at school and begged to join. Quickly Nola started to grow her involvement, becoming the troop cookie manager for her daughter's first troop, then becoming a co-leader, and now a leader.

Nola's two daughters continued through Girl Scouts until they aged out, and at that time, Nola considered stepping away but felt there was too much of a need in the community for other girls to be in Girl Scouts, including her granddaughters. Nola now works with an older girls and helps run a troop of 20 active Girl Scouts.

While reflecting on her fond memories of Girl Scouts, Nola said, "Everywhere I go, I run into people I have connections to through Girl Scouts. It is something you have your entire life. The connections and memories." Girl Scouts has been one of the best experiences of her life, the comradery of the adults, the opportunity to watch girls develop and grow makes Girl Scouts her family

forever.

Nola says she gives because she wants to ensure that as many girls as possible are ready for the 'real' world. And she hopes they will be more prepared for adulthood than she felt she was.
