## A leader in the making

The Girl Scout Outreach Program at Girl Scouts of Utah has had a profound impact on the lives of the girls in our community. Through partnerships with 30 community organizations, we have been able to provide Girl Scout programming to girls in various settings, including after school programs, family shelters, refugee communities, and domestic violence shelters. Currently, we serve over 700 girls, and the feedback we have received from our partner sites and girls has been overwhelmingly positive.

In the last 6-8 months, we have witnessed a significant shift in the girls' engagement and enthusiasm. They eagerly wear their Girl Scout uniforms on non-Girl Scout days and express disappointment when it is not a Girl Scout Day.

It has been exciting and heartwarming to watch this program grow.

We want to share a special story about a girl in one of our staff-led troops. Our Outreach Program Manager, Bonnie Billings, has led this troop for over a year.

This girl was uncertain about selling cookies at the cookie booth. After a few positive interactions with customers, she turned into a model salesperson! She approached customers with confidence, efficiently filled their orders (and upselling at every opportunity!), and accurately handled the money. Because it was a new experience, she continued to seek reassurance; each time, we assured her that she was doing exceptionally well, and with every check-in, we could see her pride and confidence grow.

When it was time to drop the girls back home, Bonnie took a minute to express her gratitude for how helpful the girl had been to the other girls. Her smile was pure joy, brighter than ever before.

This story exemplifies the transformative power of our Girl Scout Outreach Program. By providing support, trust, and belief in these girls, we witness growth and self-assurance. ### **Reminiscing about Camporee**

Three days, 500 campers, one mission! Camporee '23 (themed "Camporee Survivor") was held at legendary Trefoil Ranch. Over the course of three days, the Camporee campers experienced Girl Scout traditions, engaged with each other and with the natural environment, and all emerged as Camporee Survivors.

Television Survivors are tasked to "Outwit, Outplay, and Outlast." The Camporee challenge was to build girls of Courage, Confidence, and Character. Instead of eliminating players, we all finished camp stronger together. We had 500 campers all from different walks of life, working together to build courage, confidence, and character.

Camporee highlights included a massive SWAP exchange\*, a "tent city" in our camp meadow, "Idol Chase" scavenger hunt, outdoor skills activities, a campfire complete with s'mores, and an epic dance party.

Camporee is an important step in camping progression, increasing outdoor competence, confidence, and interest, all while teaching environmental stewardship to girls. Camporee facilitates a sense of belonging for Girl Scouts within our statewide sisterhood.

SWAPS stands for "Special Whatchamacallits Affectionately Pinned Somewhere." They are small tokens of friendship that Girl Scouts exchange with one another, and each SWAP uniquely reflects a

fellow Girl Scout, their troop, or a memory of a special event. They're a great way to share stories and get to know Girl Scouts from across the country and the world.



#### Summer Camp is in full swing!

This summer Trefoil Ranch will deliver outdoor programming to almost 2,000 participants. Girl Scouts have been busy singing songs around the campfire, making new friendships, challenging themselves with new activities, and falling in love with the outdoors.
