GIRL LED

Girl Scouts take an active role in making decisions and choosing activities; they have a choice and a voice.

COOPERATIVE LEARNING

Girl Scouts work together in an atmosphere of respect and cooperation to complete projects and learn.

LEARNING BY DOING

Girl Scouts learn through hands-on activities that engage them in an ongoing cycle of action and reflection.

By participating in skill-building activities through the Girl Scout Leadership Experience, Girl Scouts:

DISCOVER

They'll find out who they are, what they care about, and how to best use their unique talents.

CONNECT

They'll collaborate with others, both locally and globally, to learn and expand their horizons.

TAKE ACTION

They'll do what Girl Scouts always do: make the world a better place.

The GSLE aims to foster the development of five key leadership outcomes

STRONG SENSE OF SELF

Girl Scouts have confidence in themselves and their abilities and form positive identities.

POSITIVE VALUES

Girl Scouts act ethically, honestly, and responsibly, and show concern for others.

CHALLENGE SEEKING

Girl Scouts take appropriate risks, try things even if they might fail, and learn from mistakes.

HEALTHY RELATIONSHIPS

Girl Scouts communicate their feelings directly and constructively resolve conflicts.

COMMUNITY PROBLEM SOLVING

Girl Scouts want to make the world a better place, learn to identify problems in the community and create "action plans" to solve them.
